## SUNDAY NOVEMBER 13, 2011---THE 33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### Stewardship---Be Stewards of Your Time, Talent and Finance

We have finally come to STEWARDSHIP COMMITMENT SUNDAY. This is the day when we will be asked to indicate what we will be giving back to the Lord for all that the Lord has given to us. For some, this will be just doing again what we have done in the past. For others it might be a totally new step in your relationship to Christ and the Church. I do hope and pray that wherever you are in this line between “committed” to stewardship and “I’m just considering it for the first time,” you will take a step forward in your journey with God.

#### Stewardship In the Scriptures

The Old Testament reading today, Proverbs 31: 10-13, 19-20, 30-31, tells the story of a “worthy wife” who uses her time and talent in a good way to help her family. It doesn’t mention of giving to God, but someone who takes her duties seriously as a wife and mother will surely give back to the Lord in prayer, praise and worship, and also give of her treasure too. The gospel, Matthew 25: 14-30, touches directly on giving back to the Lord of our “treasure.” The servants were given talents of 5, 2 and 1 and were expected to use these talents in a productive way so the master could have them back with earnings. So Jesus is using this parable to tell all of us to use our time, talent and treasure in a positive way and return a portion to God, the giver of these gifts from the beginning. It’s really no different than putting our money in a bank and expecting it to earn interest. We all expect that, and in the same way God expects us to use our financial talents in such a way that we return a proper portion to him through the Church.

#### Calculate and Maybe Take A Step

I must confess (not in confession) that each year of my priesthood I can see how much more God has blessed me. I then have to re-calculate what I should be giving back to God and increase it a little more each year. Possibly many of you can look back and see how God has blessed your life over the past year. If so maybe you too could take a step in your giving of Treasure back to the Lord. You possibly could also give more of your time and talent as well. We can never out give God for all he has given to us.

Make sure also that you calculate what percentage you are giving, lest perhaps you just give a few dollars that doesn't even register on a percentage scale. 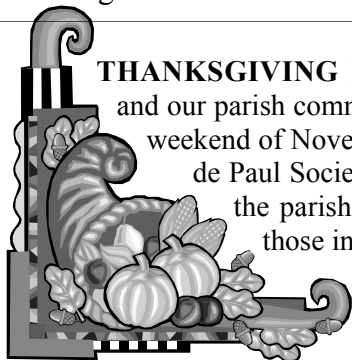

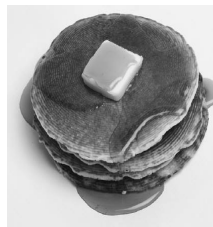
