SUNDAY NOVEMBER 20, 2011---CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY

Jesus is King, Savior and Lord

Christ the King Sunday is the last Sunday of the Church year. We end the year with a great show of power and might because Jesus can do all things, even come back from the dead. As our King and Savior, he gives us a share in his victory. All that is required is that we accept him as Savior and Lord and live his law of love. It's right there in the gospel today, Matthew 25:31-46. We will all be held accountable for all we have done or not done. Jesus isn't trying to force us to do anything, but he is saying that if we want to share in his eternal kingdom after this life, then we have to follow his way

When the Son of Man (Jesus is referring to himself here) comes in his glory he will separate us just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. Even our Old Testament reading today, Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17, tells us that we will be judged as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. So we have to be ready for that day when Jesus will look at all we have done or not done. All I can say is that if you have come to Mass today you are at least heading in the right direction so that with a hope and a prayer and all your good works, Jesus will place you on his right with all the sheep who are destined for glory, "For I was hungry and you gave me food..." We all have to look deep within ourselves to see how we have kept the commandments and lived his love. We all can make changes in our life for the better. Let's start making those changes now so we will have that much more good on our side when we have to stand before Christ Our Shepherd and Our King.

STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY was last Sunday. Everyone had an opportunity to show what he or she would be giving back to the Lord in return for all we have received. If you were away or did not sign your "stewardship intention card" yet, I urge you to do so this weekend. This will be a step in faith for you but it will also be a step into a blessing. I feel that way myself. When I give generously to God I always get back blessings in abundance. So when we give generously to God, then we receive generously from God. Yes, it takes some sacrifice because we could use these funds in all kinds of exciting ways for our self other than for the Lord and his Church. But giving a proper and generous portion back to God is surely going to bring blessings upon us. "Give, and it shall be given to you..." (Luke 6: 38). And don't worry about signing a commitment card because it is basically between you and God. Yes, our parish would like to know what your goal is so we can plan our budget, but no one is going to make demands of you if you can't give what you indicate. Think about it. Pray about it. Believe me, you will feel good if you take that step and sign your intention card. Bless you all.

THE CHANGES IN THE MASS will take place beginning next weekend, starting with the Saturday evening Mass on the First Sunday of Advent. Please be sure to use your Missalette during Mass as well as the laminated card in your pew. I'm sure it will take a while to get used to, but we can all work together and make these readjustments in an orderly way. And don't worry, we priests will have a lot to learn and change as well. But beyond all the changes may we all realize that the Mass really hasn't changed. Rather it's just a few words that are changed around to help make it more clear and understandable. Do I hear an "AMEN" to that?

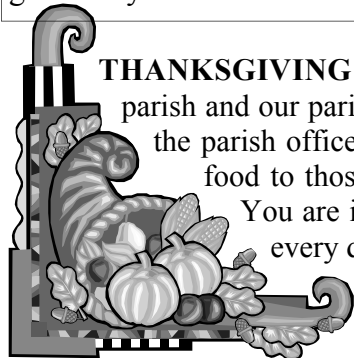
